



WHAT WE KNOW – COVID-19 STATUS – VACCINE UPDATE



- FDA Approval versus Emergency Use Authorization (EUA)
- Based on the current information available about the vaccines, the CDC, WDHS, local health departments and our local hospitals have issued the following guidance:
- Public health recommendations for vaccinated persons
 - Protection from the vaccine is not immediate; vaccine is a 2-dose series and will take 1 to 2 weeks following the second dose to be considered fully vaccinated
 - No vaccine is 100% effective
- Given the currently limited information on how well the vaccine works in the general population; how
 much it may reduce disease, severity or transmission; and how long protections lasts, vaccinated person
 should continue to follow all current guidance to protect themselves and others, including:
 - Wearing a mask
 - Staying at least 6 feet away from others
 - Avoiding crowds
 - Washing hands often
 - Following CDC Travel Guidance
 - Following quarantine guidance for an exposure to someone COVID-19
 - Following any applicable workplace or school guidance

WHAT WE KNOW – COVID-19 STATUS – VACCINE UPDATE



Here is a more in-depth summary of what is known to date:

- The vaccines received Emergency Use Authorizations (EUA). The vaccines may only protect individuals receiving the vaccine.
- They appear to be safer than contracting the disease for those:
 - At higher risk for severe disease symptoms and outcome by virtue of medical condition (But is it available equitably?)
 - At higher risk for severe disease symptoms and outcome by virtue of socio-economic condition (But is it available equitably?)
 - At higher risk for severe disease symptoms and outcome by virtue of employment conditions and exposure. (But is it available equitably?)

WHAT WE KNOW – COVID-19 STATUS – VACCINE UPDATE



Here is a more in-depth summary of what is not known to date:

- It is not known whether the vaccines prevent the transmission of the disease.
- It is not known how long the immunity lasts.
- It is not known how vaccination rates will impact regions where the disease is rampant or as the virus continued to mutate.
- The vaccine has not been studied yet in pregnant women or children. Specific recommendations are available through your health care provider.

DOING WHAT LOVE REQUIRES – WISCONSIN COUNCIL OF CHURCHES UPDATE

- Two Step Process
 - Vaccination Rate
 - Cases/100,000 (Daily New Cases/7-day rolling average)

Dashboard Green <50 Active Cases/100,000

When is it safe(r) to gather?

UNSAFE

Vaccination < 50%

Viral Transmission
Cases >10/100K
Positive Tests >10%

MAKE IT SAFER

Vaccination 50-70%+

Viral Transmission
Cases 5-10/100K
Positive Tests <10%

SAFEST

Vaccination 70-85%+

Viral Transmission
Cases <1/100K
Positive Tests <5%

- Varies but Not Recommended to Meet ELCA Greater Milwaukee Synod, ELCA South Central Synod, Metropolitan Community Church (MCC), UCC, Lower Susquehanna Synod ELCA (20 cases/100,000),
- Varies by Parish/Recommendations or Restrictions Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Milwaukee, Roman Catholic Diocese of Madison (no dispensation), Roman Catholic Diocese of LaCrosse (dispensation), Presbyterians, Fond du Lac and Eau Claire dioceses (25% of capacity)
- Meeting Orthodox Church in America, American Baptists (by church)
